# Rl President's Message

This will ensure that they remain engaged in our clubs and inspired to be Rotarians for life.

Throughout the world, Rotary is admired for its vocational service and for the time-honored values we instill in all business relationships. As we continue our work to grow Rotary, let us remember that vocational service remains a crucial selling point to potential members.

Rotary Connects the World, and by making Rotary's vocational service work known to people in more professions and at different stages of their careers, we will help grow our organization and make it stronger and more diverse.

This year our Annual Jaipur Limb Camp was held from 1st to 7th January 2020 at Ganesh Bagh, Infantry Road . Rtn. Virchand Nahar Chairman of the camp under the guidance of Rtn. Gautham chand Nahar did an excellent work.



Inauguration of the camp was done on 1st January by our District Governor, Rtn.Dr.Sameer Hariani, Mr. Prabhakaran, CSR Head of L&T Technology Service Ltd and Rtn.Dr.K.R.Venugopal, Vice chancellor of Bangalore University in the divine presence of His Holiness Sri. Vinay Guruji. Sri Vinay Guruji blessed RBP for commencing a new year with such a humanitarian project. District Governor appreciated Rotary Bangalore Peenya's commitment to this project since 23 years and congratulated the club for restoring the limbs for more than 40,000 people till date .Mr.Prabhakaran assured all the support from his end for such a noble cause. Token of reward were distributed to all the technicians from Jaipur BMVSS and all the volunteers for their dedicated support.
